Vineyard/Vintage Notes:

50% Spinetta Vineyard, 50% Manby Vineyard. Grown on steep mountainous terrain in the higher elevations of the Shenandoah Valley of Amador County, California. The strong presence of Italian heritage in Amador County has Barbera a signature trademark of Amador County. This can be attributed to the fact that the climate in Amador County is very similar to that of the Piedmont region of Italy. With generally moderate temperatures and adequate precipitation, the grapes are able to thrive during the warm summer months. In addition to the climate and precipitation, Barbera is also adaptable to many soil types, but thrives best in soils usually considered “poor” or in the case of Italy and Amador County, decomposed granite and volcanic soil.

Winemaker’s Notes:

Produced in the Italian old world, food friendly style.

Tasting Notes:

A delicious balance of earthy and savory aromas with flavors of fresh, ripe blackberries and raspberries. Notes of cola and red licorice flow into a flavorful, lingering finish.
